# **Happy Mother's Day!**

Mother's Day is celebrated by over 40 countries around the world. In 1914, Mother's Day became an official holiday in the United States. Anna Marie Jarvis, a social activist, founded Mother's Day in 1908 to honor her late mother. Jarvis used white carnations as a symbol for Mother's Day and was quoted as saying, "Its whiteness is to symbolize the truth, purity, and broad-charity of mother love; its fragrance; her memory and her prayers."

Jarvis' quote poignantly describes the unique role that mothers play. There is nothing like the unconditional love and support of a mother.

Writing this article makes me think of my late grandmother, Lois, who was born only four years after Mother's Day became an official holiday and died last March. She would always tell all

Annie Bell Cole, Longtime Court Street Resident Annie Bell Cole was born in Holly Springs, Mississippi, on May 11, 1929 to a family of farmers. They moved around a lot and settled in Memphis, Tennessee when Annie was 7 years old.

Street Resident Annie's been fortunate to live a number of places in her lifetime. She spent several years in Memphis, Chicago, Washington DC, and, most recently, here in Flint with us. She's part of three generations of Court Street Village residents – both her mother and daughter have lived here too!

Annie has spent most of her life caring for others. She had 7 children of her own and has worked as a housekeeper, a nanny, and at Crestwood Nursery School. At Court Street Village, she spent time serving as a Senior Companion.

Annie received her GED while living in Washington DC. Though this is a great accomplishment, her family stands out as one of her major contributions to the world!

In addition to having 7 children, Annie has 23 grandchildren, 56 great-grandchildren, and 5 great-great-grandchildren! Annie attributes her ability to get through the loss of several family members to her faith.
